ARE YOU IN NEED OF DRIVERS? ACCESS A TALENT POOL OF HIGHLY SKILLED PROFESSIONALS AT NO COST TO YOU!

Commercial truck and bus drivers are in high demand, with a current shortage of qualified drivers. Service members are a great renewable resource for talent, they come equipped with the skills to get the job done and an unmatched work ethic. Many occupations in the military require the operation of heavy military vehicles, similar to commercial vehicles.

The Dept of transportation recognizes this skill set and has developed a program to assist service members and veterans in transitioning to civilian transportation careers. These programs are designed to make it easier, quicker, and less expensive for experienced military drivers to obtain Commercial Driver's Licenses (CDLs). Let's dive into them!



MILITARY SKILLS TEST WAIVER PROGRAM

As of today, there are more than 26,000 service members and veterans have taken advantage of this waiver program. The Military Skills Waiver program allows veterans and prior service drivers with at least two years' experience safely operating heavy military vehicles to obtain a CDL without taking the driving test (skills test). The program is available in every state.Participation Requirements:

PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

- To participate in the Military Skills Test Waiver Program, you must have held a military driver's license.
- Have at least two years of safe military driving experience (including no disqualifications, suspensions, or license revocations).
- Military drivers must apply within one year before or one year after leaving a military position that required the operation of a commercial motor vehicle.
- Reserve or National Guard, veterans, or transitioning from active duty are candidates

EVEN EXCHANGE Program:

Knowledge Test Waiver

This program allows qualified military drivers to be exempt from the knowledge test to obtain a CDL. When used in conjunction with the Military Skills Test Waiver, this allows a driver to exchange a military license for a CDL. Drivers must provide proof of their medical certificate to apply.



06 UNDER 21 MILITARY DRIVER PROGRAM

UNDER 21 GUARD AND RESERVIST CAN BE A GREAT WAY TO ACCESS TALENT.

All states with the exception of one issue CDLs with intrastate restrictions to individuals ages 18-20. The restrictions imply that these drivers cannot operate commercial motor vehicles (CMVs) in interstate commerce. To assess the safety impacts of allowing qualified military drivers younger than 21 to operate CMVs in interstate commerce, FMCSA has launched a three-year pilot program. With commercial drivers in high demand, this pilot program is designed to provide civilian career opportunities in transportation to Reserve and National Guard members ages 18, 19, and 20.

FMCSA is coordinating with the military services and motor carrier associations to recruit motor carrier and driver participants. You can access the list of approved motor carriers (trucking company or related business in interstate commerce) below:

DRIVER REQUIREMENTS

- Are 18-20 years old may participate,
- Received heavy-vehicle driver training and experience while in service,
- Hired by an approved motor carrier.
- Approved occupational specialty code (MOS) or job rating for this program, and

When participating drivers reach the age of 21, they may continue to drive for participating carriers and possibly serve as part of the driver control group.

COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATOR SAFETY GRANTS

ESTABLISHED IN 2005

Another program FMCSA has provides funds to educational institutions that provide commercial driver training, including accredited public or private colleges, universities, vocational-technical schools, post-secondary educational institutions, truck driver training schools, associations, and state and local governments. These Grants help institutions recruit and train service members and their families for professional bus and truck driving careers.

PROGRAM GOALS

The grant program was established by Congress in 2005 through the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act – A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU), as amended by the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act Section 5101 and codified as 49 USC Section 31103, has two goals:

- to expand the number of CDL holders possessing enhanced operator safety training to help reduce the severity and number of crashes on U.S. roads involving commercial motor vehicles; and
- to assist current or former members of the United States Armed Forces (including National Guard members and Reservists) and their spouses to receive training to transition to the CMV operation industry.For More information contact your state field office here

RECOMMENDATIONS:

HOW TO LEVERAGE THESE PROGRAMS

Understanding how these programs can impact your talent pipelines is key to effectively expanding your efforts and extended reach to access military talent.

The Skills Waiver and Even Exchange program can expand your outreach into talent pools you may not have already considered. Marketing to your prospective talent pool prior to discharge can help in building a winning long term strategy.

FOR EXAMPLE:

Approximately 70 percent of the Transportation Corps training, education, and execution resides inside the Reserves and Army National Guard. -Army.mil

Focused marketing efforts and partnerships with transitions programs near or around these MOS training commands can create awareness, brand recognition, and interest in potential career options with your organization.

The 21 and Under program can open doors for your organization to hire members of the guard and reserve to become drivers for your organization with no cross state line restrictions.
